Of the items in the vocabulary, only 'pDt' is somewhat common.

Notes:

For both of these objects observe the direction of writing.

Object 1: The mistake is subtle. Very subtle.

On to the hieroglyphs themselves: In each case on this item the pictures of the animals themselves form the determinatives for their names. Egyptian art often integrated the depictions right into the writing.

Object2: The term "Nine Bows" is used generically to indicate Egypt's enemies. Sometimes they are listed, as here, but the contents of the list changed over time. All you have to do here really is transliterate the names as well as you can. In many cases ancient Egyptian references to geographical locations or foreign people are not specific enough to positively identify them.
