In addition to appearing in royal names, as in Exercise 15, these signs are very common in inscriptions. Again, complementary one-sound signs usually accompany them, but the complements are often, perhaps usually incomplete. In other words, a sign like 'nTr' might appear accompanied by 'T' and 'r' but probably not 'n'.
