The new glyph shown on page 190 that represents the new moon in the old moon's arms commonly is all you see for the word Ennead.

All of the vocabulary words on page 190 are very likely to be seen elsewhere, so learn them.

For 'mni', the idea is that when you tie up your boat (moor the boat) at the end of your journey, you're all done. Hence, it's a metaphor for death.

The actual makeup of the Ennead could change from city to city and time to time. Another ideogram for the Ennead is nine strokes, usually arranged in a 3 x 3 square.
